


Wayne A. Reaud



Wayne A. Reaud was born in Jennings, Louisiana and grew up in Beaumont attending Beaumont public schools. Reaud earned his degree in Political Science in 1971 from Lamar University. He received his law degree in 1974 from The School of Law at Texas Tech University.

Mr. Reaud is a trial lawyer and the founder of Reaud, Morgan & Quinn. For over 40 years he has represented clients in significant cases involving personal injury, product liability, premises liability, toxic torts and business litigation. Mr. Reaud was responsible for first impression mass tort litigation involving asbestos premises and computer liability claims, including the largest asbestos product liability class action lawsuit in the history of Texas courts. He also represented the State of Texas in its landmark litigation against the tobacco industry.

Mr. Reaud currently serves as Chairman of the Board of the Beaumont Foundation of America and is Chairman of the Reaud Charitable Foundation. He also serves as a Member of the Board of the Huntsman Corporation. For a decade he served as a Regent of Lamar University. He is a Life Fellow of the Texas Bar Foundation and a Fellow of the International Society of Barristers, a member of the Philosophical Society of Texas and a member of the State Bar of Texas Grievance Committee. Mr. Reaud was chosen as the Most Distinguished Alumni of Texas Tech University Law School in 1998 and also chosen as the Most Distinguished Alumni of Lamar University in 2006. Mr. Reaud was awarded the Honorary Order of the Coif by the University of Texas in 2011. He is listed with the Best Lawyers in America.
